19-21 May 2023 – Santa Cruz Away and Overnight Ride

There are two main options you may choose from:

The Highway 1 route from South San Francisco along the coast to *Mission Inn & Suites* in Santa Cruz or the shorter segment starting in Half Moon Bay at Poplar Beach. This is the route, which historically has prevailing tail winds. Plus corresponding return routes.

The inland route skirts past San Jose, then enters the hills into Santa Cruz, while avoiding Highway 17, which is not suitable for bicycles. A bike path runs in the vicinity, with a 2-mile section of crushed gravel. The return route may be optimal, for those wishing to avoid any potential head winds and benefit from different scenery. It will not return to Half Moon Bay though and is 68 miles long.

There exists a BART station at Millbrae. Even though it reduces the longer routes by about 6 miles, it is not as pleasant as the South San Francisco ferry, takes 53 minutes longer and requires a transfer. Anybody wishing to participate on the longer route southbound should assemble at the **Main Street Ferry at 0750 on 19 May for an 0800 departure**. Consult the TA ride calendar. Don't forget your Clipper card. Driving to Half Moon Bay from Alameda takes around one hour. Alameda to the hotel in Santa Cruz is 69 miles or about 1 ½ hours by car.

It is estimated that after reaching the South San Francisco ferry terminal at 0900, an average speed of 14 mph will allow an arrival time at the **Poplar Beach parking lot in Half Moon Bay for the meetup with car drivers at 1100 on 19 May** and an arrival in Santa Cruz at around 1500.

The entire group can have lunch with outside seating at the *Sacrilege Brewery + Kitchen* on 730 Main Street, 1 mile from Poplar Beach (opens 1130). http://sacrilegebrewing.com/ We can decide to start the ride from there, although we will return to Poplar Beach to get on the bike path.

Long distance riders are urged to make arrangements with drivers for luggage transport in advance!

Bypasses tunnel at Devil's Slide

We may decide to have lunch in Pigeon Point Light Station State Historic Park (Mile 46), if food and drink can be arranged


Meetup at Poplar Beach (Mile 25) at ≈ 1100 if members in carpools leave from Alameda at 1000





Long-Term Parking near South San Francisco Ferry Terminal

If you prefer to **drive** to the starting point of the longer ride to Half Moon Bay, you may park in the multilevel parking garage at SFO, reserved for long-term parking. You will be obliged to make your own way to the ferry terminal to rendezvous with the members arriving by ferry. The distance is 3.8 miles and meanders along the coast for a full 3 miles on the San Francisco Bay Trail. Verify the arrival time for the ferry, so you arrive on time where the official ride starts.

Similarly, for the return trip from Santa Cruz, you will eventually depart from the route to return to SFO Long-Term Parking.



On the **coastwise** route via Poplar Beach to Daly City BART, you would turn from Highway 1 at Mile 64.5 towards SFO on Sharp Park Road. It is 7.6 miles to the parking garage. Be certain you know the route in advance! Link:

← The **inland** return route to Millbrae BART ends very close to the SFO Long-Term Parking, which is a distance of 3.8 miles to the North.

Overnight Parking at Poplar Beach, Half Moon Bay [Nominal address is Poplar St and Railroad Ave, Half Moon Bay, CA 94019]



This beachside parking was selected as a meetup point for those arriving by car and other members deciding on arriving on their bikes with the ferry from the Main Street terminal in Alameda. The latter group will take about three (3) hours from boarding in Alameda to arriving at Poplar Beach.

If meetup in Half Moon Bay is to occur at 0900 on May 19th, the ferry group would need to depart Alameda on the 0605 ferry, which is quite early (around sunrise). I would propose a meetup time of 1100, which would correspond to the Alameda ferry departure at 0800:

Poplar Beach is designated as **Day Use**. These parking passes will be printed out by Ralph and distributed on a first-come, first-served basis. Ms. Rossi is willing to meet us at Poplar Beach as well, so I may thank her in person!


Backup Parking >

If Poplar Beach is full, we will be allowed to park at the City Hall Annex at 507-B Purissima St, Half Moon Bay, CA 94019

Separate arrangements will be made by Ralph, if this should occur, and must be confirmed.

The annex is only 1.2 miles from Poplar Beach.

The meetup between short- and long distance riders will still occur at Poplar Beach (before proceeding to a possible lunch).



Day 2 in Santa Cruz, 20 May 2023 - Short Route


I have devised a 48-mile route, which I believe will work out well, starting and ending at the *Mission Inn & Suites*. It hits all the coastal sights and attractions, while avoiding potential bottlenecks, such as the San Lorenzo River Railroad Bridge.

It then ventures inland into the hillier and scenic section of about 20 miles, with two gradients of maximum 13%. However, overall climbing is restricted to no more than 2,800 feet, something the entire group may enjoy.

Lunch will be at Mile 27.6 at the *Taqueria Los Pericos* or the adjoining *Big J's Pizza* in Corralitos, and may wait for the second group to arrive, if willing to wait an extra 45 minutes. Both eateries are highly recommended. I have taken care to include bike-friendly paved trails where possible.

Average temperatures for Half Moon Bay in May are high of 62°F and low 48°F For Santa Cruz in May it is 71°F and 48°F

Day 2 in Santa Cruz, 20 May 2023 - Long Route

For those wishing for a longer route and a climb, there exists the option for a 58-mile ride with 3,600' elevation gain. The climb up to Byrne-Milliron Forest is 2 miles long with a maximum gradient of 8%.

It deviates from the shorter route at Mile 23.6 and rejoins at Mile 28.1, so both groups, short and long, may start together. Lunch will be at Mile 37.2 at the *Taqueria Los Pericos* or the adjoining *Big J's Pizza* in Corralitos, where both groups may rejoin.

Both eateries are highly recommended on Yelp.

This option should satisfy those who prefer a longer day in the saddle and will depend on level of interest.
